## Three New Groups

### BEDFORD

**February 2009** - Enjoying a weekend away with two very good friends when one of them, Jane from the Dunholme, Lincoln CBS group, informs me that it is hoped that a group will be starting in Bedford. I am very interested in joining this until the conversation develops and I understand that what she is actually saying is a group will be forming in Bedford if someone starts it, looking at me. *My reaction "no, no, no."*

**April 2009** - Meeting with Veronica to discuss how to go about starting a group in Bedford and also mention Northampton as I have contacts there. Speak to a friend, Annette, who is very encouraging. *I'm just investigating, no firm commitment.*

**July/August 2009** - Annette and I do Nehemiah study together. We find that when one of us is discouraged, the other one is able to lift them up and we keep each other going. Annette's friend, May, joins us for some sessions and is greatly encouraging. *We're just investigating, no firm commitment.*

**September 2009** - Annette and I meet with Veronica to discuss next steps. Decide we will attend training. Annette has problem with knee and ends up on crutches. Because of this and other problems unable to attend training until new year. *Never mind, we're only investigating, no firm commitment.*

**January 2010** - Annette speaks to friends at church, May and Lois, who would also like to attend training. Inform Veronica, she gets goose bumps and tells me that she and her friend Karen, who just happens to be Lois' daughter-in-law, have been praying for Lois

to be involved in CBS for some years. We all attend training. *We're now all just investigating, no firm commitment.*

**February 2010** - Lois enters the scene like a dynamo. First meeting of CBS group in Bedford. Eight attend. Annette and I attend conference and meet members of another new group, as well as many others and are greatly encouraged. *We are firmly committed.*

**March 2010** - I have a fall and break my collar bone. Two weeks later a member of our group has a fall and breaks her shoulder. We keep going and are encouraged knowing the group we met at the conference are praying for us. *We are still firmly committed.*

**April 2010** - Annette and I have exactly the same idea while chatting on the phone. Coincidence? We will ask a local church, St. Marks, to display a CBS poster. Annette knows the minister. *We determine to move forward, firmly committed.*

**May 2010** - A member of our group requires an operation and this is scheduled for the end of May. Every other member of our group is having some sort of hospital test. Annette asks St Marks if they will display poster and gives in a leaflet. (My sister suggests advertising for accident prone and ill to join our group.) Next day the minister visits Annette and says he is more than happy to display the poster and informs her that he studied under one of the members of the board of reference, knows Dr R T Kendall and will see if he can expand our group! Waiting to see what happens next. *Excited and firmly committed.*

### CARDIFF

In May 2009 Grace Wort introduced me to CBSI and put me in touch with Janet Phillips, Caleb to Wales, who was visiting Cardiff at the time.

I am not very proactive in setting up anything new, so I invited a few friends from church who I thought might be interested in hearing Janet and possibly doing something about these studies. I remember clearly that

first meeting. It was very encouraging to hear about CBSI classes around the world and how the Lord had been working and changing people's lives, but it was Janet's shepherding heart and the love she poured through her prayers on us, complete strangers, that gave me this overwhelming desire to experience God working among us here in Cardiff. If only someone would start a class...

The more I dreamt about it, the more convicted I felt to do something about it. The more convicted I felt, the more afraid I became! As I was praying about it one evening, the Lord gave me the verse Jer 1:6-8. I guess I could run but I couldn't hide!

It's been wonderful watching God working. As we started the 'If you will pray' study in the book of Nehemiah, none of us felt confident about taking on a leadership role, but we held on to Neh 2:20: 'The God of heaven will give us success. We his servants will start rebuilding...' It's been amazing to see the Lord going before us, preparing, equipping, encouraging and leading us every step of the way.

We started our class 'properly' after Easter, opening it to the community.

We were thrilled to see people arrive, eventually 19 forming 2 discussion groups! What an encouragement from our faithful God! Some of the members have never been to a Bible study group before and it's such a blessing to see their joy in sharing their faith and making discoveries in the Word together. The Lord is really ministering to us all through this class.

Unsurprisingly, the enemy is not happy about these changes in our community. He has tried various tactics to distract and discourage us, but, thanks to the faithful prayers of our brothers and sisters from other CBSI classes, we've been carried and supported through. Isn't it wonderful that we are ALL branches of the glorious and beautiful VINE? If we REMAIN in Him and He in us, we WILL bear much fruit to our Father's glory.

## MANCHESTER

I became a Christian at the age of 50, whilst living – literally and spiritually – on the mountaintops of Buenos Aires, Argentina. It was a surprise to experience a different style of church when we returned to Britain, and we moved to York. I was invited to an open evening to learn more about CBSI and found that the study format really suited me. **Sue's Story...** I was born and brought up in South London and lived for many years in the Old Kent Road. I was the oldest of 4 and at the age of 10 was sent, like many children were, to Sunday School, probably so my parents could have some peace and quiet. Although I didn't have a Bible we were given memory cards with verses written on. At school I had a wonderful teacher, Miss Hewitt who told us Bible stories. I used to put my head down on the desk and imagine. As I became an adult and started work, depression set in and with it weight gain. One day, walking home from work the thought came to me that it would be so much easier to finish my life and I attempted to walk into the traffic. This being unsuccessful, I tried an overdose, but God had other plans for my life, that I couldn't imagine then. I then underwent a procedure called a Gastric Partition (stomach staples). After this went badly wrong, and having to undergo five more operations including an IJ Bypass, I did eventually lose weight. But I also suffered a heart attack which could have claimed my life. However, God had other plans for me. During one of these procedures, with fourteen days on life support, I realised how close I had been to death on many occasions. Seeing my fellow patient and dear friend die from the same procedure, I promised Jesus that if I lived, I would commit to him. During this time I married Eddie and had two lovely daughters. Having missed out on a proper education, I attended Greenwich College and gained a degree. A couple of years ago I moved to a village just outside London. I was greeted by the Church family there who showed their love to me and I started attending CBSI. It was there that I shared my feelings of doubt and inadequacy. One evening at the class, during the study of Romans 2, a light went on!! Everyone should read it - I understood God's love for me and I understood that judging other people also meant judging myself. It is a vicious circle. I received prayer that evening and I praise God for what He has done in my life. My life is different now and I praise God for the blessing I have received and the blessing I can now be to others.

You may remember Hector from previous Newsletters. Hector is a Bolivian Pastor living in the UK and leading a Spanish speaking CBSI class. We now have three classes with Bolivian Pastors as class leaders. We want to thank everyone who supports the work of CBSI and Project Malawi through their gifts, prayers and encouragement.

We return to Malawi on 23 May and our first meeting will be with the newly appointed African Regional Director, Maury Kapsner, who will be making his first visit to Malawi to visit the National Director Rutherford Banda. Your prayers for this time will be particularly important, as a good relationship between Maury and Rutherford is vital to the effective functioning of the ministry.

We will also be spending time in the villages in the Central region seeing the new work with 40+ farmers and the establishment of a primary school. Later on in the visit we will be looking at commencing a literacy



project in the deep south of the country, the Lower Shire, staying with a new Trustee of CBSI Malawi, Alec Msusa. We are hoping that we can train his wife, Iness, to start a new CBSI class in the area.

During our time in Malawi, Janette Strodder who is in the CBSI York class will overlap our visit. She will be spending four weeks at Maoni Orphanage befriending and organising activities for the children. This is a very challenging task and we would ask for your prayers for her for the month of June.

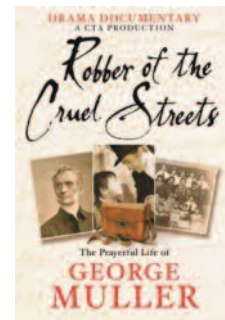
CBSI Malawi is organising its first two regional conferences in the next few months, which will mark a significant step forward in helping leaders to grasp the national vision for the ministry.

## Book Review



Robber of the Cruel Streets - The Prayerful Life of George Muller

*"He robbed the cruel streets of thousands of victims . . . with the Sword of the Spirit"*

*Daily Telegraph obituary  
11 March 1898*

George Muller was German, born in 1805, rescued by God from a wild living student life, and sent as a missionary to England. From initial work among Jews in London, he was led to the West Country and eventually to Bristol, where compassion for the abandoned children in the city streets compelled him to get involved. This work grew until ultimately there were some 2000 orphans accommodated in five purpose built houses.

No requests for money were ever made, except in prayer, yet George remained committed to the principle that God would provide, and that if He did not then he should not continue. All gifts and expenditures were faithfully recorded and the books opened once a year to demonstrate God's faithfulness and transparent financial integrity.

This book contains powerful lessons of obedience, faith, and God's provision. Our CBSI group has been studying Mark's gospel, including the feeding of the 5000 and the 4000. The compassionate heart of Jesus, His willingness to get involved and His trust in the Father to provide what is necessary have been striking lessons. George Muller is a challenge and encouragement to us to step out and trust God in the communities around us.
